


The parking brake and brake system indicator (red) comes on for 15 seconds when you pull up the electric parking brake switch.






Before Starting the Engine - Manual Transmission Models

- 2. Check that the shift lever is in Neutral. Then depress the brake pedal with your right foot, and the clutch pedal with your left foot. The clutch pedal must be fully depressed to start the engine.
- Turn the ignition switch to START without depressing the accelerator pedal.






