
Rearview Camera*

■ Changing Camera Settings


Turn the guidelines on or off.

- 1. From the Home screen, select Settings.
- 2. Select Camera.
- 3. Select Rear Camera.
- 4. Select an option:

Dynamic Guidelines: Guidelines move as you turn the steering wheel.

- 6. Press BACK to exit the menu.




